Word from the mayer

Dear citizens,

First of all, I would like to offer you my most sincere greetings.



You may have noticed that in recent years, the municipality has focused its efforts on improving its infrastructure (roads and buildings) while maintaining one of the lowest residential tax rates in the province. It is a decision of your municipal council driven by a deep desire to offer its population as many services as possible and thus to meet the expressed needs.



And 2021 will be no exception. Major projects are on the table for the current year, including the construction of a senior`s residence, the renovation and expansion of the municipal arena, the development of a bike path around the Barachois and the culmination of the Gascons sector 'water and sewer' project.

Regarding the seniors' residence, we inform you that the project is ongoing and that, according to the schedule, construction is expected to begin in June-July of this year. The plans and quotes are 75% complete and submitted to the Quebec Housing Corporation for approval and then, after the termination of these, tenders for construction will be launched.



Regarding the renovation and expansion of the municipal arena, a request for financial assistance has been made to the government and we expect a positive response in the coming weeks. In addition to hosting the community gym and a room for various activities, we will find a multi-sport field that can be used in season other than winter.





Word from de mayor...

The development of a bike path is another project that we are working on and we plan to present it to the government in the coming months. Outdoor activities are part of our service offering to our population and new residents.



Regarding the Gascons water and sewer project, we inform you that the project is still in progress despite the fact that we have to correct the situation to the effect that the water research carried out in 2008, which had been positive at the time, no longer meets the needs. The plans and specifications are completed at more than 75% and with the approval of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, we have concluded to supply ourselves either through the Newport or the Port-Daniel municipal network.

The studies have begun and a report will be submitted to us in the coming months. I am convinced that our efforts will bear fruit and that we will eventually be able to carry out this project essential to the development of our municipality.

At the economic level, everything is going well with the McInnis cement plant and we are continuing to work with them on projects to capture and develop carbon and using forest biomass to fuel the furnace. These are job-creating projects and the installation of new industrial infrastructure in our municipality.

Finally, I join the members of the municipal Council and the employees of the municipality to wish you all a good spring season and also a good season for our fishermen and plant employees.

A Word from Alex Wojciechowski, McInnis Cement's Chief Operative Officer



Good day!

The plant has just been put back into operation following our annual planned shutdown, as is our custom every winter, when markets are slower. We proceeded to change the refractory brick in the kiln and in the cyclones of the tower, and we also made various adjustments to our equipment: crushers, raw, cement and fuel mills, various conveyors and dust collection systems as well. We are fully prepared to face the 2021 season which is believed to be as active as 2020.

Moreover, McInnis draws a positive assessment of the last year: production increase of 20% between 2019 and 2020, and this, despite a one-month production stoppage due to COVID-19, sales increase of 31 %, no shortage of cement for our customers despite very strong demand, thanks to the great adaptability of our teams throughout the company, which has been able to maneuver in this very uncertain environment caused by the pandemic. We have regained control of the dust over the months and hope these unfortunate events are a thing of the past.

On the pandemic front, we haven't had any outbreaks at the plant. Some workers or employees of our contractors have been infected outside of their work place, and the disease has not spread through our site. We make every effort to reduce the risk of transmission on site as much as possible.

The cement plant's Liaison Committee, set up in 2013, is looking for a new member to represent the citizens of the Gascons Ouest sector. The committee meets four times a year (usually at the cement plant, but virtually since the start of the pandemic) and discusses the company's operations. The committee is intended to be a place of frank but always respectful discussions. If you are a resident of the Gascons Ouest sector and are interested in sitting on the cement plant's Liaison Committee, we would be happy to count on your participation.

Saint-Simeon/Port-Daniel Volunteer Centre looking for volunteers

The Saint-Simeon/Port-Daniel Volunteer Centre's mission is to promote volunteer work in different areas of human activity and to meet certain community needs. We also have just over 200 active volunteers in the field. However, the Centre is looking for volunteers to fill its community support team. If you have one to a few hours available per month, you could make a difference!

Here are our needs for Port-Daniel:

Accompanying transport: This is to accompany seniors and other people of the service during medical and social appointments (CLSC, hospital, dentist, etc.). The role of the attendant is to pick up the beneficiaries from home, drive them, wait for them and take them home; provide them with a safe and warm presence and, if necessary, provide them with physical help on the road as well as moral comfort.

This is a one-time volunteer of a MAXIMUM of 3 accompaniments per week, according to needs, and always according to your availability.

Respite- babysitting: The respite-babysitting service consists of pairing the volunteer with a family to offer them a moment of rest by taking care of the aged child, usually between 0 and 2 years of age. The volunteer must be, warm and stimulating for the child, empathetic to parental situations, respectful, attentive, endowed with good health/physical ability, responsible, reliable and discreet.

Respite is offered at a frequency of 3 hours per week at the family home and/or during social activities, for 10 to 12 respites.
